Superbrush turns Android devices into visual drawing tablets for Windows

7 Jan 2020: Software by KeloCube has released Superbrush, a first-of-a-kind Android application which allows the user to interact with native Windows applications on Android by cloning the user's computer screen onto an Android device and relaying pen and touch data back to Windows. Superbrush has full support for pressure sensitive styluses, such as the Samsung S Pen, allowing an Android phone or tablet to be turned into a fully fledged drawing tablet for Windows.



Superbrush works by connecting via Wi-Fi or USB to a Windows host application, which may be downloaded for free from https://superbrush.app. Superbrush has been designed with drawing in mind, and a lot of work has been put into minimizing the intrinsic latency in transmitting video between the Windows and Android applications. In order to achieve the smallest possible latency, hardware video encoders are utilized.
